## **DOG LITTER BINS CATCHING ON**

Many thanks to Guildford Borough Council and Tongham Parish Council for ordering, setting up and maintaining the three bright red dog litter bins now adorning Tongham Community Wood. The bins are located at the three entrances to the Wood: Blenheim Close. The Moors and Garbetts Way. All dog owners are encouraged to pick up after their dog and dispose of their litter in these bins.

We are pleased to note that the bins are being used regularly and that there is less dog litter on the paths through Tongham Wood. Dog litter covered with leaves is just a trap for an unsuspecting walker, so please do pick it up!

### FIRST OPEN INFORMATION DAY

On Saturday 17th September TWIG held their first open information day and tombola outside the White Hart pub to raise awareness of their activities, attract new volunteers and raise money to further their work. Thanks to the generosity of local businesses and villagers TWIG managed to raise a total of £71.60.

## **NEW DESIRE PATH**

Since September, users of the wood have been able to follow a new "desire path" through the oldest part of Tongham Wood, called "The Ancient Wood". The new path "follows your heart's desire" – hence the name "desire path."

The new path starts near the Garbetts Way entrance and goes off to the left where it joins the path that comes down the steps towards the play area and the butterfly meadow.

All materials used were recycled from recent health and safety tree felling and previous brush cutting and chipping activities. The path is lined with tree trunks from the Ancient Wood and covered in chipped mulch from other parts of the wood.

## **BRIDGING THE GAP**

At their November task, thirteen volunteers from Tongham Wood Improvement Group bridged the gap between the Ancient Wood and the new by building a wooden bridge over a ditch to link together two paths, improve access and enhance the growing network of walks through the wood.



Plans for the bridge were drawn up by TWIG volunteers and built on site to their own specifications with materials supplied by the Blackwater Valley Countryside Partnership.

## **A BRANCH LINE IN THEWOODS**

If you enter Tongham Wood at the Garbetts Way entrance by the flats, you are actually looking straight down the old London and South Western Railway line between Guildford and Alton! This was later extended via what is now the Watercress Line to Alresford and on to join the line to Southampton. Passenger services ran through Tongham until 1937, although goods traffic continued through the fifties. If you are keen-eyed you may spot some of the old rail preserved within the path.

In the other direction the railway ran to Ash Green, and this has been transformed into a delightful footpath near the end of which is still the old Ash Green Station (now a private house). On other paths in Tongham Wood and over the BVR near Tongham Lake, you are following the track of the branch line which ran from the old Tongham station to Aldershot Gas Works. This ran until 1960 and transported coal to the works. Again the keen-eyed can still spot clues to its past.

If you want to find out more about the Railways of Tongham, there is a great booklet by Peter Harding written in 1994 that contains lots of information and some wonderfully nostalgic pictures.
